That was the past! Over the bygone many years, nature has taken its toll. Hundreds of trees have been lost to storms. Critters, such as armadillos and foxes have continually dug into the grounds seeking food, and worst of all, mole crickets have been a continual, destructive nuisance to our greens and fairways. Although challenging, our longtime Superintendent and President, Jimmy Fayard, was up to the task, and kept the course in championship condition. Well, Jimmy retired recently and a suitable replacement has not yet been located. We now face a course that has aged, and the perfection of playing ground that once existed has deteriorated from its former condition. Correspondently, there has been a drop-off in the number of golfers playing which affects the courses' viability and could impact the future of the golf course. The current course management is an all-volunteer group working hard to restore the course to its former grandeur, and it is committed to establishing a marketing program that will bring new golfers to play the course, and prevent the loss of traditional tournaments scheduled for the future. One of the first actions was to bring back Jimmy Fayard on a consulting basis.

Although there is not much that the local Gulf Hills community can do to improve the playing conditions, each of you living adjacent to or close by the course can help by making sure that your own property presents a landscape that is pleasing and compatible to its vantage point from the course. Greetings to Gulf Hills Citizens, Its hard to believe it's already mid-February of the new year. I hope all of you had a happy holiday season and are now enjoying Mardi Gras.



I'm happy to report we saw an 11% reduction overall in crime from 2017 to 2018. The St. Martin community is our highest crime spot, with 30% of all crimes in 2018 occurring there. We have increased our patrols in St. Martin, but remember, the deputies can't be everywhere, so please be each other's eyes and ears. If you see something, say something. Although car thefts are among the crimes down in 2018 over 2017...301 in 2018, 171 last year...that's still too many. I can't emphasize enough how important it is that you lock your vehicle and don't leave valuables inside. In 99% of the cases our investigators work, the cars are unlocked.

Since we're right in the middle of tax season, I'd like to remind you of the many IRS scams that just don't go away. Don't fall for any calls from someone claiming to be from the IRS that they are investigating you for not paying taxes. The IRS does not make calls, they send letters. **DO NOT** give your information to anyone and just hang up the phone.

I am privileged to be your sheriff. My staff and I are here to help you, so please don't hesitate to call us. Have a safe spring and summer.

We've been busy! From our Traveling Turkey Thanksgiving Dinner to a lobby FULL of trikes and toys for the Jackson County Sheriff's Department "Santa Wears a Badge" program... Many of you may the months have flown by. not have heard about our Traveling Turkey din-If you recall, Panama City Florida got hit with major Hurricane Michael this past Fall. I had a personal connection in Panama City who worked for me many years ago. Thomas was well aware of what we experienced in Katrina and how we handled things. He was trying to do similar work with those around him that were far less fortunate than he. Initially, I had the idea to bring he and his family a hot Thanksgiving meal. That idea grew and grew and grew as I was telling individuals what I was planning to do. I put out the call for help to our Gulf Hills Hotel staff and to GH neighbors and their respective families and to local businesses – and the HELP poured in! My cousins and I left out of here at 8am on Thanksgiving morning in a

26' U-haul truck packed to the brim with a fully prepared/cooked (and HOT) Thanksgiving meal with all the trimmings kept hot in borrowed hot boxes from local caterers. We also amassed much needed supplies and hundreds of dollars in gift cards for Walmart and Lowes. We set up in the



parking lot of the destroyed Mt. Olive Baptist Church (pre-arranged via Thomas with Pastor Jerome). We brought everything with us including tables, chairs, decorations and our full hearts. The families in this devastated neigh-



borhood were so so grateful. They kept repeating over and over that they thought they had been forgotten in light of the wildfires and forest fires in California. It brought back sad memories of our own Katrina devastation overshadowed by the New Orleans levy break. Their BIG

SMILES said it all! It was all made possible by so many of you too many to name. You know who you are. I know who you are. I am eternally Blessed and thankful to live and work amongst you – my Mississippi angels!

We, as a hotel, have also worked with our Jackson County Sheriff's Department by being a drop off site for the Christmas "Santa Wears a Badge" Program in collecting toys for disadvantaged children within Jackson County. Hugh Seymour Lane Extension Barry Mends, GHCA Board member

The Jackson County Road Dept. (JCRD) has proposed creating a fourth entrance into Gulf Hills and they have asked for our input. The proposal is to extend Hugh Seymour Lane from Hwy 609 to Ridge Rd a little north of Hollow Oak. Seymour Ln is the road that goes to the NW JC Fire Dept. The road currently dead ends a couple of hundred feet east of Ridge Rd.



There are several advantages to this for us. Safety is the primary reason. Seymour already has a traffic light where it meets Hwy 609 and it's a straight road, unlike Pine Rd. It would create a faster route into GH for the fire dept. and would be safer than trying to turn north onto Hwy 609 from Pine.

As far as Pine Rd goes, the JCRD said that it's future is up to us. They could either leave it as it is or they could close it off and make a cul-de-sac out of it. As it is, Pine Rd has no stoplight, it has a somewhat dangerous S curve in it and there are 2 occasional homeless camps off of it.

It would take about 12 to 15 months before the work would be completed and absolutely no cost to us. This is the road dept.'s idea and they will make it happen, if we want it. Please see "Response Needed" on page 2

Société Des Arbres

Did you know there is a way to estimate the age of your large trees, and if the estimated age is 100 years or more, the trees can be nationally registered for a nominal fee?

The Société Des Arbres (Society of Trees) will register qualifying trees, or a group of trees on the same property, and send you a lovely, numbered and signed certificate with the name of the person or group registering the tree(s) and the name given to the tree(s). That's right, if you register a tree or a group of trees, you get to name the tree(s). All that is asked is for the sponsors of the tree registration do their best to protect the tree(s) for future generations.

With all the beautiful old-growth trees in our neighborhood, the Gulf Hills Garden Club decided to offer their services to all homeowners to help them identify qualifying trees on their property, and to assist in getting the trees registered if the owners would like. The club has identified it as their major new project for 2018-2019. An application form, along with the formula for estimating the age of trees, is available by going to the website of The Garden Clubs of Mississippi, Inc., and clicking on the link for Société Des Arbres. If you need assistance, the Gulf Hills Garden Club will be happy to help.

Under the administration of The Garden Clubs of Mississippi, Inc., co-chairs of the Société are Beverly Watson of Gautier and Mary Ann Westfall of Gulf Hills. Westfall is the registrar and the person who oversees the registration process. Westfall contacted can be by email, westfall2@reagan.com. Permanent records for the Société Des Arbres are maintained in the Ocean Springs Public Library Archives of History.

The Société Des Arbres was started in the early 1970s by Mrs. Donald L. "Pat" Conner (Ethelyn) of Ocean Springs in response to her distress at seeing large trees being destroyed to develop a subdivision. The basic purpose of the Société is to preserve the historic and/or aesthetic and environmental assets of any species of trees in our state or anywhere in the United States. Over 1530 trees have been registered to date in Mississippi and eight additional states.



With 700 acres of natural areas featuring over 300 species of indigenous trees, shrubs, wildflowers, and grasses as well as rare, threatened, or endangered species of plants and wildlife throughout the Arboretum's preserves, this trip promises to educate and inspire participants to take an interest in and protect the natural beauty of our area. members are welcome to travel with us. February's Garden Club meeting gave members the opportunity to learn about hydroponics gardening from Steve Hariger, a hydroponics gardener who also made a presentation last year to members of area garden clubs who, like our club, are affiliates of Spanish Trail District of The Garden Clubs of Mississippi, Inc.

The history of landscape design was the topic of January's meeting, with a presentation at the Ocean Springs Yacht Club by Dianne and Donald del Cid, owners of ARCHIterra in Ocean Springs. Dianne is a landscape architect and Donald is an architect. They encouraged attendees to consider landscape design when planning a home or other building to achieve a harmonious and overall pleasing result with less effort than planning the landscape after building. The del Cids showed photos of some of their most inspiring installations.

For their December meeting the Gulf Hills Garden Club members got together to learn from one of our neighbors, Pat DeHaan, about harvesting seeds from our gardens and the importance of saving and sharing heirloom seeds from original plant varieties. Members brought seeds and bulbs from their gardens to exchange. We're looking forward to learning about the plants we grow from these true seeds and to being able to harvest, save and share seeds with others in the future.

In lieu of planting a tree in the Memorial Garden or elsewhere in Gulf Hills for Arbor Day, the Garden Club donated to the statewide Avenue of Magnolias program to have a magnolia tree planted in Jackson County in honor of Bill Demoran, longtime Gulf Hills resident and late husband of Gulf Hills Garden Club life member Theresa Demoran.

Rubbish (no-household garbage) pickup is scheduled for the second week of every month and all limbs and debris need to be put out by 7:00 am Monday of that week.

Use the landfills whenever possible -- especially during the dry spells in an effort to prevent fire hazards -- Plus the Seaman Landfill is free to residents! Limitations of Rubbish Pick-Up

The maximum volume of trash, trees, debris and/or vegetation that Jackson County may remove per pick-up per month is 3 cubic yards.

Household garbage pickup is scheduled each Tuesday. On **THREE** major holidays (New Years, Thanksgiving, Christmas) pickup will be postponed a day. Check the holiday schedule in the newspaper or on TV.



Lighting District Reminder

Gulf Hills Lighting Commissioners, ask that you report outages or malfunctioning streetlights to Mississippi Power at 800-487-3275. Give the address closest to the light. The District is being charged for each light, working or not.
